Dear Members of the Husserl Circle,

Attached please find a second preliminary draft of the program for this year's meeting of the Circle at the New School for Social Research in New York. At the urging of the Secretary, we have extended the program to include two sessions for Monday morning of the 21st of June.

On behalf of the review committee, I would like to thank everyone who submitted a paper for consideration. I would also like to thank David Carr (Emory University), Richard Cobb-Stevens (Boston College), and Nicolas de Warren (Wellesely College) for agreeing to serve on the committee. With over 30 submissions, many excellent presentations had to unfortunately be left out of the program; but I hope that we have succeeded in putting together an interesting and thought-provoking conference.

Chairs and commentators have not yet been selected. If anyone would like to serve as either, please contact me as soon as possible. For those who have already expressed interest, please let me know if you have any preferences.

For those presenting, please send the final version of your paper that you would like to have included in the Proceedings by **June 1** to me at doddj@newschool.edu, in either Word or Text format. If we do not receive anything by then, we will use the version already on file. This year we plan to distribute the Proceedings electronically, though there will also be a limited number of bound copies available at the conference.

Please look over the program carefully, and send me any corrections regarding spelling, affiliation, paper title, etc.

And again, please note that reading time for papers is limited to **30 minutes**, and for commentaries to **10 minutes**. We have organized the schedule to allow for at least 30 minutes of discussion.

We are currently determining whether the conference rate can be extended at the three Gem Hotels (Midtown, Chelsea, and Soho) to include the nights of Sunday, June 21 and Wednesday, June 23. In any case, if you plan to make reservations at any of the three Gem hotels listed in the previous call for papers, you should do so within the next couple of weeks.
